#### Miss E.S. Innes **1900s**

Founded the Nurses League in 1925 and was eventually appointed 'Lady Superintendent' of the Infirmary. During World War 1 she

was also principal matron responsible for nursing staff across all hospitals taken over by the War Office



Set up the first renal dialysis unit in the UK. **Director of the Medical Research Council unit in** Leeds and Professor of **Urological Surgery.** Performed what was possibly the first cadaveric transplant at LGI
