

DOCUMENTS FOR NMC ID CHECK

We will check your identity at the competence test centre, and we will only accept a valid passport for this purpose. If the name on your passport is different from the name on the application and/or email/letter from the NMC authorising you to take the test, you must provide original evidence that you are the person named in that email/letter. This may be:

- Your marriage certificates
- A declaration from the awarding body that granted your nursing associate qualification, stating that both names relate to you.

If you do not bring the documents listed above, or if the passport is not valid or current, you will not be allowed to take the OSCE.

NMC staff will also be there on the day for your NMC ID check. You will need to bring all the original documents that you uploaded as part of your application. You will find a checklist of the documents on the Test of Competence invitation email from NMC confirming your eligibility to sit the CBT and the OSCE.

If for any reason you do not have all your original documents on the day, the NMC will schedule another face-to-face appointment with you. This will need you will have to return to the Test Centre with the document required. You will still be able to sit your OSCE exam and receive your OSCE exam result, but you will not be able to progress to the last stage of the registration process until you have attended your follow-up ID check.

Information on police clearance and DBS certificates

You will need to provide a police clearance from each overseas country you have lived in for 12 months or more (*in total, not necessarily consecutive*) in the last 10 years.

Also, if you've lived in UK for 3 months or more, you'll need to provide a Disclosure and Barring Service (*DBS*) check.

These documents must have been issued after you left each country, otherwise we may ask you to get a more recent version when we assess your application.

Your police clearance from the country you're residing in at the time of your application should be issued no more than 12 months before the date you're uploading it to your registration application.

Check how to apply for these

These documents may take some time to be issued depending on the local authorities responsible for issuing them, so you should make sure you understand how to obtain them and how long they take to arrive.

GOV.UK has published a helpful guide on how to obtain overseas police clearances, which may assist you with your application.
