The Leeds Teaching Hospitals operates 2 Early Years Day Nurseries. Clarendon Nursery (onsite at Leeds General Infirmary) and The Mosaic Centre (located close to Chapel Allerton Hospital and St James University Hospital). We

take pride in encouraging and supporting each child to reach their full potential and do this by offering individually tailored play and learning activities in warm and friendly environments. Each of our nurseries offers a different experience. They are different sizes, layouts and staff teams really make each setting unique.

Both our nurseries follow the same ethos, policies and procedures and have the added benefit of being able to draw from one of the country's largest Teaching Hospital Trusts to enhance our services. This includes having access to children's dieticians to plan our menu's and support from the Trust safeguarding teams. We work in partnership with the local authority and follow all OFSTED regulations.

If you choose to join our nurseries you can be assured of a warm and friendly welcome in environments which are child centred while maintaining highly professional standards, allowing children to feel safe and secure while enjoying their youngest years.



Partnership with Parents

We believe very strongly in working in partnership with parents and carers and see our nurseries as an extension of their nurturing environment at home.

We understand that working together with you has the most positive impact on your child's confidence, self-esteem and trust. Family stay and play sessions and Fun Days are planned throughout the year as well as many other opportunities for us to come together to celebrate. We will work together to build a profile of your time with us and share this with you via our Parent Zone App.

The app is secure and safe and can be easily downloaded. On here you will receive regular information such as sleep times and meal information as well as regular photos and observations and reports. We also encourage parents to add photos and observations from home.



Our Teams

Our staff Teams take great pride in what they do. Each setting has different number of staff relevant to the required child to staff ratio's set by OFSTED and all Key Carers have a recognised childcare qualification at level 2 or 3.

Many of our staff have taken on additional training and qualifications which enhance our settings.

Each Nursery has a management team with a full-time nursery manager and deputy manager. We also benefit from a fulltime Early Years Teacher who works with the staff and children to create a curriculum tailed to each setting and the children's needs. All staff hold a recognised paediatric First Aid qualification.

The Early Years Foundation Stage

Our curriculum approach is underpinned by a strong understanding of how children learn, with continuous opportunities for outdoor learning and exploratory play.

We believe that play is the best vehicle for children's learning. It is vital for children's development and welfare. It is how they express strong feelings, rehearse experiences and interact socially. Play is the main medium through which we teach and this includes a daily balance between child-initiated free flow play and planned activities which engage children and stimulate creativity, wonder, enthusiasm and enjoyment. When planning our curriculum we follow The Early Years Foundation Stage Statutory Framework (2021) which highlights 4 overarching principles enabling practitioners to ensure that the children in their care continuously learn and develop. It is of importance when supporting at all children's learning and development, that we recognise that children develop and learn at different rates.

At Clarendon Nursery you are able to feel the family community we instil within our setting that flows between the rooms, providing a positive, loving, safe environment to nurture all children that come to Clarendon Nursery. We may be a smaller environment but this allows us to have the close, loving community feel and have a great partnership with Leeds General Infirmary, from carol singing, pantomimes and visits from friends, we allow children to have real life experiences. Explorers and Discoverers are our smallest rooms but provides a homely environment for our youngest children to explore and transition to Nursery life while giving them new experiences to showcase their learning and development.

Investigators and Pioneers provide a stimulating environments for children to SPARK their imagination. We cater for every child and follow them on their journey through play. We encourage independence and offer challenging experiences which encourage children to problem solve, develop limits and boundaries while being able to take risks in a safe secure environment.

The Mosaic Centre is our largest nursery where we have endless possibilities for outdoor exploration, we have been gifted an extensive area for children to explore with wonderful areas created which include, gardening, bug hotel, digging area, mud kitchen and much more. Come join Mosaic in racing around the track on bikes, creating and nurturing plants, making delicious meals out of mud (not for parents) wrapping the branches of our tree, creating birds' nests to care for animals and investigate our special tree by taking leaves and using the bark. The environment offers a safe space for children to get creative and provide a hands-on approach to outdoor play. Although we have four beautiful base rooms that care and nurture for your children the doors in each room open straight into our garden. We offer good practice and activities to the children through our creative team that provide inspiration to children's imagination.



Frequently asked questions

Is there a settling in policy?

Yes, all new families will have a minimum of three visits which will increase in duration leading up to the agreed start date.

Can I make savings on the cost of my childcare?

If you are employed by the Leeds Teaching Hospital NHS Trust or one of the participating Trusts you could save up to 36% of the costs by using our Salary Sacrifice Scheme. This means the cost of your childcare will be taken from your gross pay (before tax, NI and pension contributions). We also accept Childcare Vouchers and Tax Free Childcare.

Do you accept Government Working Family Grants?

Yes, each nursery is registered to receive the Government Working Families' Grant for eligible children from the school term after they turn 9 months, and the Education Grant for eligible children from the school term after they turn 3 years. Please see our separate leaflet 'Government Funding and Trusts Nurseries' for more information.

What do I pay for holiday periods?

Your monthly fees will remain the same if you are on holiday or if your child is sick. Nursery fees are also pro rata so you pay the same amount each month (excluding any extra ad-hoc days).



Is there a minimum number of days/sessions per week?

Yes we ask that all children attend nursery a minimum of two full days per week.

Do you offer ½ days and flexible places?

Unfortunately due to continuity of care and sustainability we are unable to offer ½ days or flexible places at this time.

How many days of the year are you open?

We are open all year-round Monday to Friday except bank holidays and each nursery has one training day per year.

How long is my contract for?

Your contract is flexible, but any changes will need one months' notice, including leaving the nursery and changing days etc..

Is there a registration or retainer fee?

Yes. A retainer fee will be charged once a place has been offered and accepted. The amount depends on days/sessions required, usually £100 per day/session. So for three full days you would need to make a one-off payment of £300.
